Effective advance care planning can assure patient autonomy at the end of life even when the patient has lost decision-making capacity. Medical futility is difficult to identify in the clinical setting but may be described as an intervention that will not allow the intended goal of therapy to be achieved. prognosis is uncertain and death may be approaching, to communicate this to our patients, to change the focus of our care to ensuring quality of life and, to minimise symptoms and disability at the end of life. If dying is not recognised, then harm may result from provision of burdensome and undignified treatment and, loss of time to accept death and say goodbye. End of Life Care in Frailty: Law and ethics | British ... The AMA Code of Medical Ethics offers guidance that strongly encourages end-of-life planning and advance directives. The Code defines the physician's role and recognizes the fundamental tenet of patient autonomy, including the patient's right to modify a decision. The guidance addresses major issues in end-of-life care and

includes support for patient decisions to withhold or withdraw life-sustaining intervention, and orders not to attempt resuscitation. Medical ethics and end of life: What every patient should ...
