Most neonatal transfusions are carried out in low birth weight preterm infants treated on neonatal intensive care units (NICUs). Transfusion triggers in neonates are controversial and mainly based on expert clinical opinion, although recent randomised controlled trials of 'liberal' versus 'restrictive' red cell transfusion policies in very low birth weight preterm babies are starting to influence clinical guidelines. Neonatal transfusion guideline For the purposes of transfusion medicine, a neonate is defined as an infant under four months of age. The pre-transfusion testing required for neonates is more limited than that required for older infants, children and adults. For neonates, the required testing includes ABO and Rh(D) typing and an antibody screen. Neonatal and Pediatric Transfusion | Professional Education In neonatal intensive care units (NICUs) most transfusions are given to preterm neonates (mostly <32 weeks gestational age; National Comparative Audit of Blood Transfusion, 2010), some of whom will require transfusion beyond 28 d of life. In general, babies of all gestational and postnatal ages on NICUs will tend to be transfused using the same guidelines although there is little evidence specifically related to term babies.
